

Unruly Parties & Underage Drinking

People who begin drinking before age 15 are 4 times more likely to develop alcohol dependence than those who start drinking at 21 years of age.³

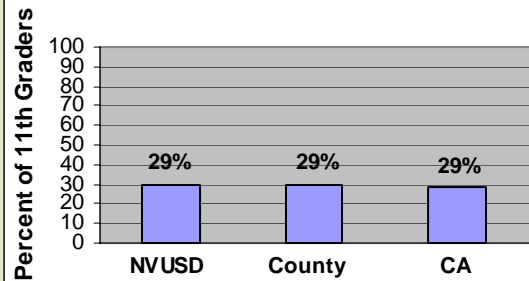
WHAT'S THE PROBLEM?

According to the 2009 California Healthy Kids Survey, underage drinking is a problem among NVUSD students.

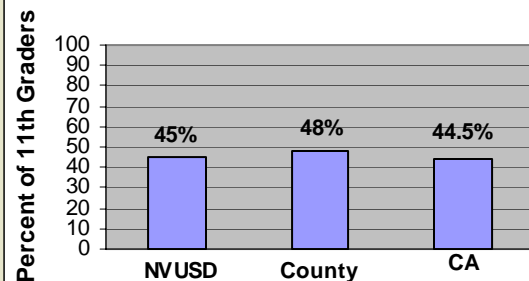
Among 11th graders in the Napa Valley Unified School District (NVUSD):¹

- 39% report drinking alcohol in the past 30 days
- 29% report that they have driven after drinking alcohol (themselves or by a friend)
- 42% have used alcohol by the age of

Percent of 11th Graders Who Have Been Drunk or Sick From Drinking Alcohol

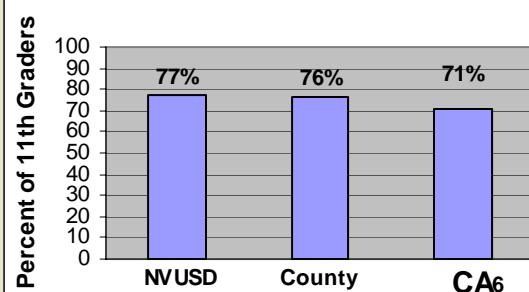


IT'S EASY FOR YOUTH TO GET ALCOHOL

Most NVUSD 11th Graders report that it is **fairly easy** or **very easy** to obtain alcohol.

Most underage drinkers from NVUSD report that they usually get their alcohol at **parties** or at **home**.

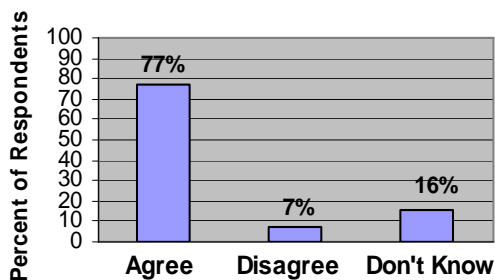


WHAT DOES MY COMMUNITY THINK?

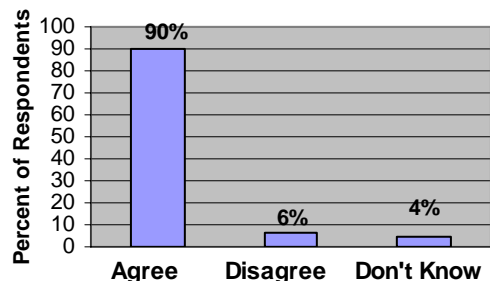
Underage Drinking is a Problem in My Community



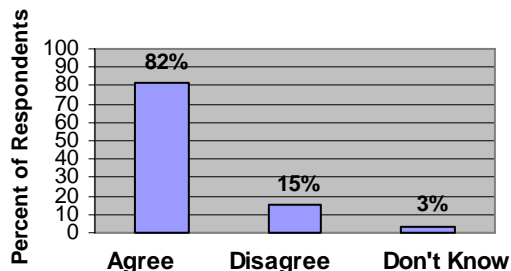
